3) Kainos Community - www.kainoscommunity.com

Kainos Community has been operating in prisons in the UK for over 10 Years. They deliver 'Challenge to Change' programmes, accredited by the prison service, which are aimed at reducing re-offending. The interventions are delivered within a community setting, providing an environment for prisoners to address their offending behaviour through course work, community living, team building, social interaction and ongoing individual assessment.

Langley House Trust is a national Christian Charity providing resettlement for ex-offenders (or those at risk of offending) working towards crime-free independence. Their residential projects along with associated move-on facilities and floating support services, offer a range of supported accommodation and they are able to work with those who are hard to place or who have special needs. Their services are open to men and women of any or no faith.

MMUK provides residential care for young women aged 18-28 with life controlling issues, such as eating disorders, self harm, depression and the effects of abuse, in all its forms. They deal with the root cause of the issues instead of medicating the symptoms through our structured programme that deals with all aspects of a women's well being. They desire not only to see a young woman graduate from the programme, but discover her purpose in life and go back to her community adding value to it.

Trapped in a downward spiral of addiction and crime, feeling hopeless and rejected by society, men are being released from prison into society without any of the skills needed to make a new start. Nehemiah has transformed the lives of over 120 men at Brixton Prison in the past three years with its A New Direction course. Consistently oversubscribed at Brixton, the course was the first of its kind in the UK. They are a Christian Ministry that allows broken men find freedom and rebuild their lives.

Pain To Gain Limited is a company formed to develop and deliver high quality accredited courses and interventions to be delivered into the UK prison and probation services. Their programs will be attractive to correctional service providers because of their ability to engender safer custodial environments and lower re-offending rates. Their programs seek to engender safer custodial environments and to challenge offending behaviour. Firmly founded on a Christian ethos, this company seeks, through its programs, to promote social and moral responsibility, self-respect and the dignity that is the inalienable right of all people. They currently offer an accredited victim awareness course and several short interventions designed to support prisoners with vulnerabilities. They are currently operating in HMP Croydon and HMP Dovegate.
